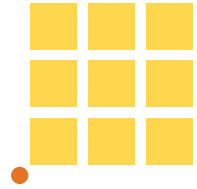

CASE STUDY:

Horse Sense, Marshall, North Carolina

INITIAL BRIEF:

For this very special destination for individuals, and especially children, who work in therapy with both a therapist and a particular horse, the objective—both for office and home—came down to creating spaces of comfort and balance.

DESIGN STRATEGY:

Nothing fussy, just a sense of being able to plop down anywhere, working or relaxing in the midst of engaging colors and natural materials.

APPLIED IDEAS:

Lots of inviting touches, colorful window treatments, peaceful settings for man, dog and cat.
